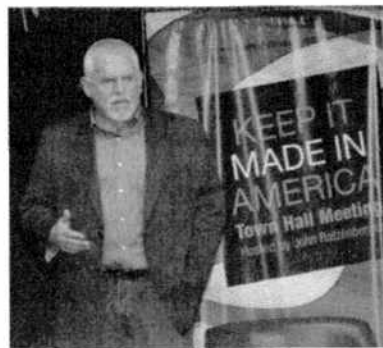


You Are Invited To A Very Special Event
